Adult Education Career Pathways Coach/Instructor (FT/12 month) Alexandria Campus

CLTCC serves six parishes (Avoyelles, Concordia, Grant, LaSalle, Rapides, and Winn) in central Louisiana and has five sites: 1) the Main Campus in Alexandria; 2) the Ward H. Nash Site in Cottonport; 3) the Huey P. Long Site in Winnfield; 4) the Rod Brady Site in Jena and 5) the Ferriday Site in Ferriday.

Additionally, CLTCC provides instruction for several prisons and correctional institutions.

SUMMARY:

Reporting to the Assistant Director of Adult Education, the Adult Education Career Coach/Instructor will provide instructional services to adults and youths out of school in basic skills such as reading, writing, and mathematics with the purpose of increasing the students' educational functioning levels and preparing these students to obtain their high school equivalency diploma (HiSET). This position will also provide relevant wrap-around services and transitional services to Adult Education students with an emphasis on Adult Education Career Pathways Program participants with the goal of helping students develop their personal, leadership, and employability skills to ensure positive post-secondary experiences. The Career Coach acts as mentor and motivator to students enrolled in the Adult Education Career Pathways Program with the goal of increasing the rate of student retention and student success. The Career Coach will further help students identify their barriers and come up with solutions for overcoming those barriers. The coach will also help students set goals for themselves, both short-term and long-term, and will revisit those goals frequently to help students see the progress being made. This position is expected to work closely with the Adult Education Student Data & Transitions Coordinator, Adult Education Site Coordinators, and Adult Education Instructors in order to help Adult Education Career Pathways Program participants develop their college and career success skills. This position will teach part-time in addition to providing transitional/career coaching services to students.

This position is a grant funded position and the continuation of the position is dependent upon funding availability.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Instructor Duties

- Responsible for teaching Adult Basic Education, and high school equivalency preparation courses using instructional methods geared toward the adult learner in a classroom setting.
- Responsible for teaching the HiSET test areas (reading, writing, social studies, science, and math) or adult basic education skills areas (writing, math, language).
- Responsible for teaching Workforce Preparation courses to Adult Education & Career Pathways Students.
- Responsible for teaching Community Education courses, including but not limited to College & Career Transitions, Digital Literacy, Financial Literacy, Health Literacy, and Workforce Preparation.
- Plans and prepares relevant and practical classroom lessons and monitors student's performance.
- Administers the Official HiSET Practice Test (OPT) to students.
- Implements a variety of instructional delivery methods, that include group or individualized instruction as well as computer programs that help students make learning gains. Relies on experience and judgment to accomplish goals.

- Completes and maintains appropriate student registration, attendance, and assessment records, and ensures timely submission of data to data-entry staff for National Reporting System (NRS) input.
- Makes use of online instructional programs to supplement in-class instructional delivery.
- Administers Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) tests to determine individual progress.
- Creating a climate that encourages and supports learning.
- Enrolls and registers students into the Adult Education Program.
- Communicates with students and community about program services as part of outreach and enrollment growth effort.
- Recruits students into the Adult Education Program and Adult Education Career Pathways Program
 (Integrated Education and Training, and the Five for Six Scholarship Program) to ensure continual flow of
 students concurrently entering the HiSET and Career Pathways programs.
- Performs other duties as assigned by the Director of Adult Education.

Career Coaching Duties

- Assists with and promotes student transitions into the workforce and postsecondary education through programs such as Integrated Education & Training (IET) or the Five for Six Scholarship Program.
- Recruits students into the CLTCC Adult Education/WRU Program and CLTCC Adult Education Career Pathways Program (Integrated Education and Training, and the Five for Six Scholarship Program) to ensure continual flow of students concurrently entering the HiSET and Career Pathways programs.
- Assists students in applying for degree/non-degree programs at CLTCC and other colleges/universities.
- Provides prospective and current students with information regarding the current job market and trends in career choices.
- Develops and presents workshops providing individual coaching regarding employment search strategies and methods, resume and interview preparation, and other professional development topics for Adult Education students.
- Assists prospective and current students with career exploration activities and career assessments. This includes test administration duties.
- Guides Career Pathways Program students through the entire admissions process to ensure accurate and timely enrollment into Adult Education/WRU classes and the Adult Education Career Pathways Program, thus establishing a pipeline into future for-credit college programming.
- Guides Career Pathways Program students through the financial aid/FAFSA process to ensure timely and accurate processing of information in preparation for entry into Adult Education Program and Adult Education Career Pathways Programs.
- Provides navigational services throughout students' time at CLTCC, even after HiSET completion-in order to ensure higher persistence, retention and completion rates that benefit students and college as a whole.
- Follows-up with students after exiting the Career Pathways Program to ensure accurate data is collected (credentials earned, completer data, job placement data, etc.).
- Collaborates with local Workforce Development Boards and other workforce-related entities to ensure students register and qualify for external partner benefits and assistance.
- Arranges for additional tutoring as needed for at-risk students in order to better support supplemental teaching and learning practices in and out of the classroom.
- May be required to visit multiple campus locations and community-based locations throughout the work week
 in an effort to maintain effective communications on a consistent basis.
- Performs other duties as assigned by the Director of Adult Education.
